Four Distinct Seasons

This central location makes weekend trips or visiting family in other regions straightforward.	Air Travel Joplin Regional Airport offers limited direct flights to select destinations. For broader flight options, Tulsa International Airport (1.5 hours) and Kansas City International Airport (2.5 hours) are within reasonable driving distance.
